Media:

Learning: In January students in PreH/Head Start enjoyed books and songs about winter. Students in Grades K-5 participated in lessons about digital citizenship. Students in kindergarten, first, and second grade identified ways they can be good digital citizens, including pausing when it is time to put away a device and generating ideas for how they will be good digital citizens when they are using devices online. Students in third grade considered how their online activity can impact themselves, their community, and the world. Fourth grade students drew comics to show how they could be an upstander when cyberbullying happens. Fifth grade students examined the curiosity gap and how the curiosity gap is used to create clickbait headlines.

In February students in PreK/Head Start will read fiction books about animals and view videos to learn facts about the animals. Students in grades K-1 will be reading picture books that have been nominated for Maryland's Black-Eyed Susan Awards. Grade 2 students will read picture books and identify the point of view of the characters in the books. Students in Grade 3-5 will be engaging in activities related to Black History Month, including reading informational text, conducting research, and sharing their ideas with their classmates.

Learning:

Music:

Learning: Music Measurement Topics for the third marking period are performing music and responding to music.

- *Pre-K / HS, Kindergarten, and First grade*: Students have learned about Rhythm and keeping a steady beat by singing and moving to all kinds of music! We also "Ice Skated" along to music using paper plates to slide across the floor. In February and March, our focus will turn to performing with a variety of instruments to show more high/low pitch and grade level rhythms.
- Second grade and Third grade: In February students will read whole notes, half notes, sixteenth notes and the dotted half note to perform some new songs. Reading pitches on the staff and performing them on instruments has also been great fun. We are reading music!
- Fourth grade and Fifth Grade: Students have been performing partner songs such as "The Canoe Song", and adding their own created rhythms on classroom instruments! We will continue to learn about pitch and the staff in the coming months, as well as writing and performing music.

Physical Education:

Learning:

PreK-2 will be learning the 5 jumping and landing patterns, balancing activities, and weight transfers in gymnastics. We will also start jump roping! Students will also learn about activities that promote fitness, and the role of the muscular and skeletal system.

Grades 3-5 will learn about creative movements, (sequence, rhythm, formation, contrast, and coordinating movements with others). Students will also create a tumbling sequence using static balance, weight transfer,

and rolls. Students will also discuss the need for rules in a social movement setting and learn about ways to resolve conflict when working with a group or team.

Adapted PE:

Learning: Our students are comfortable with our warm-up and stretching routines. We are seeing so much growth and improvements in many students. We will work on balancing, jumping patterns, and dance and rhythm. Equipment is modified for success.

Instrumental Music

Counseling:
