English Language Arts

This year, our first grade students will build literacy and language skills by participating in ten cross-disciplinary units of study in our Benchmark Advance Program. Each three-week unit features a topic, ranging from economics to earth science, history and culture to themes in literature, and more. As students read poems, stories, plays, and informational articles, they will strengthen their reading and writing skills and strategies, participate in meaningful collaborative conversations, and make connections to their other content area studies.

In reading this month...

We will spend the first 20 days of instruction focusing on our foundations and routines. Students will become familiar with our expectations, and they will have plenty of practice before we dive into Unit 1. We will review some of the content that was taught in

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kindergarten to help students refresh their skills. These first 20 days will help set students up for a successful school year.

Math

In math this month ...

We will begin working on Module 1. Students will make significant progress towards fluency with addition and subtraction of numbers to 10. Students will work on breaking apart a total into two parts, showing the number pairs "inside" of a whole number.

Topic A focuses on all the numbers within 10 in *put together* situations, with a special focus on the numbers 6, 7, 8, and 9.

Topic B continues the process of having students compose and decompose by using number bonds and counting on from the first part to totals of 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.

In Topic C, students will interpret the meaning of addition from *adding to with result unknown* or *putting together with result unknown* story problems by drawing pictures and writing equations.

In Topic D, students will further their understanding of the *counting on* strategy by using 5-group cards.
