## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Public Schools - Epinephrine Availability and Use - Policy Requirements

- FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to establish a policy to 4 authorize certain school personnel to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to certain students under certain circumstances; requiring a certain policy to 5 6 include certain information; providing that a certain policy may authorize a 7 school nurse to obtain and store at a public school auto-injectable epinephrine for certain purposes; requiring certain public schools to submit a certain report 8 9 to the State Department of Education; requiring the Department to develop and disseminate a certain standard form; defining certain terms; and generally 10 relating to an epinephrine availability and use policy in public schools. 11

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article - Education
- 20 7-426.2.
- 21 (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED. 22

- 1 (2) "ANAPHYLAXIS" MEANS A SUDDEN, SEVERE, AND POTENTIALLY LIFE-THREATENING ALLERGIC REACTION THAT OCCURS WHEN AN INDIVIDUAL IS EXPOSED TO AN ALLERGEN.
- 4 (3) "AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE" MEANS A PORTABLE, 5 DISPOSABLE DRUG DELIVERY DEVICE THAT CONTAINS A PREMEASURED SINGLE
- 6 DOSE OF EPINEPHRINE THAT IS USED TO TREAT ANAPHYLAXIS IN AN
- 7 EMERGENCY SITUATION.
- 8 (B) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A POLICY FOR PUBLIC
- 9 SCHOOLS WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION TO AUTHORIZE THE SCHOOL NURSE AND 10 OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO ADMINISTER AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE.
- OTHER SCHOOL PERSONNEL TO ADMINISTER AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE,
- 11 IF AVAILABLE, TO A STUDENT WHO IS DETERMINED TO BE OR PERCEIVED TO BE
- 12 IN ANAPHYLAXIS, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THE STUDENT:
- 13 (1) HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS HAVING AN ANAPHYLACTIC ALLERGY, AS DEFINED IN § 7–426.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR
- 15 (2) HAS A PRESCRIPTION FOR EPINEPHRINE AS PRESCRIBED BY
- 16 AN AUTHORIZED LICENSED HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER UNDER THE HEALTH
- 17 OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.
- 18 (C) (1) THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS 19 SECTION SHALL INCLUDE:
- 20 (I) TRAINING FOR SCHOOL PERSONNEL ON HOW TO 21 RECOGNIZE THE SYMPTOMS OF ANAPHYLAXIS;
- 22 (II) PROCEDURES FOR THE EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATION 23 OF AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE; AND
- 24 (III) THE PROPER FOLLOW-UP EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.
- 25 (2) THE POLICY MAY INCLUDE A PROVISION AUTHORIZING A
  26 SCHOOL NURSE TO OBTAIN AND STORE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL AUTO-INJECTABLE
  27 EPINEPHRINE TO BE USED IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION.
- 28 (D) (1) EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL SUBMIT, ON THE FORM THAT 29 THE DEPARTMENT REQUIRES, A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT ON EACH 30 INCIDENT AT THE SCHOOL OR AT A RELATED SCHOOL EVENT THAT REQUIRED
- 31 THE USE OF AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE.

- 1 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND DISSEMINATE A 2 STANDARD FORM TO REPORT EACH INCIDENT REQUIRING THE USE OF 3 AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
