Dear Sequoyah Elementary School Community,

I am writing to share information about radon testing at your school. All Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) were tested for radon in 2016. Since then, MCPS conducts periodic testing to ensure that radon levels in schools continue below the action level of 4.0 picocuries per liter of air (pCi/L), as recommended by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). For schools that have an active radon mitigation system, periodic retesting occurs every two years. For facilities that showed no elevated radon levels, retesting is conducted every five years.

The most recent test results indicate that all rooms and offices tested had radon levels below the EPA recommended action level of 4.0 pCi/L. Periodic testing will continue on the schedule described above.
