

IB Social/Cultural Anthropology standard level Subject Brief

The IB Diploma Programme, for students aged 16 to 19, is an academically challenging and balanced programme of education that prepares students for success at university and life beyond. Students take courses in six different subject groups, maintaining both breadth and depth of study. Social/Cultural Anthropology is a group 3 course, individuals and societies. In addition, three core elements – the extended essay, theory of knowledge, and creativity, action, service – are compulsory and central to the philosophy of the programme.
