

Cosmetology

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Cosmetology is a three-year program. Students in Cosmetology are instructed in the science and art techniques of the beauty industry, focusing on hair, nails, and skin care. Areas of theoretical instruction include professional development, safety and sanitation, bacteriology, human anatomy and physiology, mathematics and measurements, chemistry, salon business, and diseases of the hair, skin and nails. Students also gain experiences through hands-on practice with actual clients in areas of hair styling, haircutting, hair coloring, manicuring and pedicuring, and chemical texture services.

Credit Hours, Work-Based Learning, and Licensing:

Credits: 3 credits per year toward graduation requirements

The Maryland State Department of Education and State Board of Cosmetology mandated Cosmetology students maintain a minimum of 75% on all competencies.

The Marking Period grade reflects the percentage of mastery of the objectives for class work in the Cosmetology program. This includes presentations, projects, class assignments, homework assignments, and summative and formative assessments. The following MCPS grading scale will be used:

- 90-100 = A
- 80-89 = B
- 70-79 = C
- 60-69 = D
- Below 50 = E

Components of the grade:

•	Formative includes Practical Application and Theory	40%
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•	Summative	30%
•	Learning and Employability Skills	20%
•	Homework	10%

In order for students to be eligible to participate, the Maryland State Department of Education and State Board of Cosmetology have mandated Work-Based Learning (on the job training), she/he must meet the following criteria:

- Successfully complete 1000 hours of combined theory and practical instruction
- Maintain a grade of 75% or better in both theory and practical performance /required competencies
- Maintain a 94% attendance rate



- Student behavior in class will reflect all rules as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct, the Student Handbook, and the Cosmetology program policies and expectations
- Students will be expected to maintain an exemplary level of attendance (94%)
- Students will be in the classroom and prepared for class before the tardy bell rings
- Students will be dressed in professional program attire. Students who are not dressed in uniform and prepared will not be permitted to participate in the practical aspect of class for that day and will receive no credit



The Maryland State Department of Education and State Board of Cosmetology mandated students maintain a minimum of 94% attendance rate.



Uniform includes smock and work-duty shoes (must be leather, closed toe and heel, and flat rubber sole- no heels) for safety and sanitation purposes
