IMPORTANT REMINDER FOR ALL PARENTS FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE:

We receive lots of calls from parents late in the day asking that we deliver messages to students. We frequently also have parents dropping by in the last 20 minutes of school wanting to pick up their children early.

We want to accommodate all requests. However, it can be difficult to get messages to students on a moment's notice. It means looking up the schedules, then interrupting teachers during their planned lessons.

The school has some strategies in place for getting kids out early. Please send a note with the student in the morning requesting that your child be in the office at the time that you get here. The student then gets a pass, which is then presented to the appropriate teacher at the appropriate time. The student comes to the main office without being contacted by the office. You sign your student out, and off you go!

You don't wait, the student is confident that s/he will be retrieved in a timely manner, and the classroom and teacher are not interrupted during their lessons.

So, it is recommended that you consider employing a similar strategy to help your students remember after school schedules – write a note and put it in or on the Student Handbook. It's an opportunity for the student to get a quick reminder and have some correspondence from mom, dad, or caregiver during the day – a little pick-me-up!

Ms. Rice's COUNSELING UPDATE

As parents, we hope that our children will be accountable for their actions. We want them to take responsibility for their choices, whether good or bad. We want them to make good choices, but we really can't tell them what to do. We have to guide them through modeling and conversation and hope they choose wisely.

In middle school, children become "tween" agers and eventually teenagers and there is a shift from the nuclear family being the most influential to friends holding more and more sway. It's tough to find that your influence isn't the biggest anymore and no doubt your child/tween/teen will make some choices that aren't what you would have hoped for. The most important thing we can do is maintain open communication, be positive, and let our children learn from their own positive and negative experiences. Here are some ways to help your child learn accountability.

- Demonstrate personal responsibility any value you want your teen to have, you can demonstrate that. If you want them to be accountable for their actions, you should be accountable for yours. Avoid blaming. Follow rules. Accept the consequences if you break the rules. If you make a mistake, admit it, apologize, make amends.
- Create a culture of accountability in your home. No one should be allowed to change the rules to fit their needs. Everyone in the house should be required to take responsibility for their actions.
- Establish boundaries have set rules and clear expectations. If your teen breaks the rule, follow through with a consequence. Don't give up or give in because they whine, get angry or promise to behave. Following through is what makes the change. (Make sure you can handle the consequences that you give so you can follow through. If you say you're taking the phone – take the phone.)
- Be involved in their life. Establish open communication and then find out about their interests. Show your support and that you value them. This will make them more likely to want to please you or work with you.
- Don't be overinvolved. Let them work things out on their own. Keep an eye on their social media accounts from a distance, but don't question everything they say and do. Let them email their own teachers with questions and you be their backup support.
- Don't be so quick to toss out the life raft. It's so painful for parents to watch their children go through difficult things, but our children need to learn what they are capable of. We can support them without rescuing them and let them go through the learning process. After all, we'd rather them learn now in the safety of home than later out on their own.
- Allow natural consequences. This is the best parenting you can offer and often the best way to learn accountability. If your child doesn't do a big project, don't do it for them. Let them learn to be responsible for the good and the bad decisions they make.
- Never underestimate a compliment praise them for making responsible choices but don't shame them for making poor decisions.

MAP TESTING

The MAP Growth Assessment is a diagnostic assessment designed to inform instruction, recovery, and intervention and account for learning loss, as well as determine the present performance levels of students on literacy and math standards. North Bethesda will administer the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. This year we will be administering MAP–R and MAP–M through English and Math classes. We will follow a special block schedule (see below for specific testing dates). On the day of testing, we will operate a block schedule. Here is a link to the NWEA family toolkit site to learn more about MAP.

Students who miss or need additional time to complete their test will be notified by either their math or English teacher with make-up dates and times. A student may be pulled from classes to complete this required assessment. This test will not affect grades.

Outlined below is the testing schedule for the Fall administration of the MAP diagnostic tests for North Bethesda Middle School:

You can use this <u>Attendance Note</u> template for Absences, Tardies, or Early Dismissals. MCPS requires a *doctor's note* for absences of 5 days or more. For an absence of 3 days or longer, homework may be requested by calling the Counseling Office at 240–740–2110.

Teachers enter attendance for each period into Synergy, the attendance system. All class absences generate an automated call/email to parents. If you believe there is an error, *please contact the teacher* and the attendance office.

Directory Information:

Schools provide directory information for public listings such as honor rolls, awards, and other notices in the newspaper or on the Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) website. A student's name, address, and telephone number may also be released to organizations of any combination of parents/guardians, teachers, and students at this school. **Unless you tell them not to**, schools can release the information without your prior consent.

If you do not want your school to release your directory information, complete the form linked nerve and return to school by September 11, 2023. Additional copies of this notice can be found on the <u>MCPS website</u>, and are available in Spanish, French, Vietnamese, Chinese, Korean, Amharic, and Portuguese. This form must be completed every year. Your school will assume you agree to the release of the directory information, unless this form is returned by Friday, September 11, 2023

If you want to continue to keep your child's information available, you "DO NOT" need to complete this form.

If you need to change your decision later, just contact your school directly. If you enroll after September 11, 2023, you can complete this form at the time of enrollment.

INFORMATION FROM THE DIVISION OF FOOD AND NUTRITIONAL SERVICES

Students in Maryland who qualify for reduced-price meals will not be charged for meals.

Meal Prices

- Breakfast: Regular Price (All Levels): \$1.30; Reduced Price (All Levels): No Cost
- Lunch: \$2.80 (Middle and High); Reduced Price (All Levels): No Cost

Students may qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on household size and income. They may also qualify if they are receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA), or Medicaid benefits. Families may apply for meal benefits by completing an Application for Free and Reduced-Price Meals for the current school year.

Federal eligibility guidelines change each school year; therefore, a new application must be submitted each school year. All students in the family should be listed on one household application. A notice will be mailed home to each student if you are approved for meal benefits or do not qualify for meal benefits. Please keep this important document for your records and use throughout the school year. Families may apply for meal benefits at any time during the school year.


